As our parish has progressed through the ***Our Faith – Our Hope*** campaign, I have highlighted particular portions of the campaign needs to explain in further

detail. Now I want to focus your attention on two other needs the campaign will address – Adaptive Reuse of Parish Facilities and Enabling Parishes to become Multi-Staffed.

Adaptive Reuse of Parish Facilities \$8,000,000

Adaptive reuse is the act of finding a new use for a parish facility in a thriving community. The most successful adaptive reuse projects are those that best retain the parishes' significance and add a layer that provides additional value for the future. When done well, adaptive reuse can restore and maintain the significance of a parish and help to ensure its mission for the next generation. These facilities then can create valuable community resources and revitalize existing neighbourhoods.

The Anglican community has much to gain from adapting and reusing its church facilities. Environmental benefits, combined with energy savings and the social advantage of re-imagining a place of worship, make adaptive reuse an essential component of sustainable development. It helps conserve building materials and embedded energy, and avoids negative environmental impacts of demolition, landfills, and new construction. ***Our Faith – Our Hope*** will allow the Diocese to assist parishes in vibrant communities reinvest in their physical plants.

Enabling Parishes to Become Multi-Staffed \$6,000,000

Across the Diocese, parishes provide a variety of ministries and programs for all ages. In order to

continue to provide the services necessary to fulfill the needs of their people and community, parishes must become multi-staffed. Parishes require funding assistance to be able to offer a full-range of programs.

The Diocese is committed to allocating funds to select parishes that are capable of providing the right leadership and focus on ministry. Enabling these parishes to become multi-staffed will foster a new style of leadership for both lay and clergy, expand ministries and promote development of fresh expressions of the Church. These multi-staff parishes may also be used as centres of excellence for our ordained and lay leaders. Trained personnel will instruct our leaders and equip them with the resources necessary to bring God's message to their communities.

I am excited to announce that the ***Our Faith – Our Hope*** campaign has reached a total of \$43,600.00 in pledges from a total of 10 gifts. This total represents 36 % of our overall goal. We now have an average gift of \$4,360.00.

Again, I am thankful for the generosity shown by the families who have already given. Thank you to everyone who is helping to make this campaign a reality with your generous gifts of time, talent, and treasure.
